What is Street Scramble? A number of checkpoint locations are circled on the course map. The descriptions above tell you what to look for at the exact center of each circle. On foot, visit checkpoints in any order, and answer the question at each one. Circle your answer on the question sheet. Each checkpoint has a point value. Your goal is to accumulate as many points as you can during the time limit. Go solo or in a small team of people from your same household.

A purple triangle on the map marks the official start location, the platform of the Lenin statue. Start and stop your time at that location if you want to compete for an official result in the virtual race. Return to the start location before the time is up. There is a 10 point penalty for each minute (or fraction) you are late. If you'd like us to include your result in the official standings then send us your elapsed time, your team name, number of team members, and a photo of your answer sheet. We'd also love to see your photos and stories from the course, and we welcome you to share them on the Street Scramble Facebook page or email them to us.

Results will be posted at StreetScramble.com and updated periodically, as answer sheets come in.

Important Rules

- * Comply with all laws and directives, including staying out of private areas and observing social distancing measures, including giving others 6-feet of space.
- * Teams that wish to be ranked officially may not split up to visit different checkpoints.
- * Don't shine lights into people's yards looking for checkpoint answers. This course is designed to be done during daylight hours.
- * Circle answers only for checkpoints you actually visit. Don't guess, don't ask others for answers, and don't use your phone to get answers. Wrong answers are penalized in order not to reward guessing. Even if you know the answer ahead of time, don't circle it unless you go there (if you're competing officially.)
- * Travel under your own power only, on foot. It's fine (for purposes of the informal competition) to use wheelchairs, strollers, and similar mobility aids.

The course map is reasonably accurate and up-to-date, however it is made from imperfect data and has not been checked or corrected in most places. We have made corrections only where it is quite important to this Street Scramble event. The map is generalized, so only select paths and buildings are shown. The map includes a legend of symbols.

Safety: You are participating at your own risk. We strongly encourage you to wear bright colors to enhance your visibility to others when you do the course. Be very careful crossing streets and bike paths! Please be courteous to others, and wear a face covering when distancing is not possible.

Special notes on map and checkpoints

Checkpoint features are at exact centers of circles. There are 36 checkpoints, and the maximum possible score is 1000.

The map is printed with true north at the top, so the magnetic north arrow is slanted about 16 degrees clockwise.

A number sign (#) in the checkpoint description means an address number. Abbreviations: N means North, S means South, E means East, and W means West. "Ball" means an ornament ball, and "tree" means a Christmas tree. m means meters (about 3.28 feet)
